

The Wheatland County Dog License fee is \$20.00 for spayed or neutered dogs (with proof of spay/neuter) and \$50.00 for intact dogs per year.

Licenses may be purchased at the Wheatland County Office or by filling out and mailing this form. Office hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday.

Payment can be dropped off in person or mailed to Wheatland County. Payment via credit card can be completed through the County website.

Please refer to Wheatland County "Animal Control" Bylaw 2020-17 to review the Responsibility of Animal Owners, Limit on Number of Dogs, Emotional Support Animals, Licencing of Dogs, Working Stock Dogs, Vicious Dogs, Fines and other relevant information. This bylaw can be viewed on the Wheatland County website or by contacting Protective Services at 403-361-2026.

The numbered dog tag you receive for each license will be valid for the lifetime of the animal as long as the license is renewed annually on or before January 1st. Should the tag be lost or stolen, please notify the County office immediately to cancel the tag – a replacement will be re-issued for free.
